Follow this simple method to help your child eat well

Parent/Adult Decides...

- WHAT foods to offer
- **WHEN** to offer foods
- WHERE to offer foods

Be Patient!

It is normal for children to eat only foods they know and they may have to see the food many times before they decide to try it.

Trust Your Child!

Offer your child 3 meals and 2-3 snacks a day. Children will eat as much or as little as they need.

Child Decides ...

WHETHER to eat
HOW MUCH to eat

Eat with your child without pressuring him to eat!

This is the only thing that helps your child accept new foods.

Forcing, bribing or shaming kids to eat does not work! It may slow down acceptance of new foods and increase the risk of eating problems.
