Ailments

- › urinary tract infection (UTI) uncomplicated
- › pink eye

- › allergies and hay fever
- › canker sores

- › fungal infection of skin or nail

- › heartburn (GERD)

Contraception

Pharmacists can prescribe and provide many types of contraceptives. Many are free in B.C.

How it works

1. Check your symptoms and book an appointment with a pharmacist at www.gov.bc.ca/seeapharmacist. Walk-ins without a booking may also be available.
2. The pharmacist will review your symptoms and medical history.
3. The pharmacist will recommend the best course of action, which may include a prescription.
