

Gastroenteritis or Noro-Like Illness Outbreak in Island Health

IPAC/MHO complete investigation and risk

assessment:

OUTBREAK DECLARED

Staff:

- Symptomatic staff are excluded from work until symptoms resolved for at least 48 hrs.
- Notify <u>PWHCC</u> if symptoms develop

Unit Lead/Designate

- Post OUTBREAK sign at door and PRECAUTION signage at patients* room/bed space, directing visitors to the nursing station prior to visiting
- Complete GI Tracking List
- Submit updates to: ICP (Island Health) or Environmental Health Officer (EHO) (Affiliates) each morning
- Advise symptomatic staff to contact:
 - <u>Provincial Workplace Health Contact Centre</u> (Island Health Staff)
 - their family physician (Affiliate staff)
- Provide safety information to visitors, i.e., hand hygiene, correct donning/doffing of PPE as required

Additional Precautions

- Discuss bed closures, admissions, transfers and discharges with OMS
- Cancel communal dining and group activities for affected patients*/units
- Encourage symptomatic patients* to stay in room
- Clinical appointments may be postponed, if necessary
- ICP/EHO to complete risk assessment on exposed patients in multi-bed rooms and request additional precautions, if necessary

Housekeeping

 Housekeeping participates in OMS, operationalizing actions and maintaining Precautions Plus cleaning for affected rooms and all common areas
Refer to outbreak cleaning guideline A Viral Gastroenteritis or Noro-Like Illness Outbreak will be declared over:

Island Health Facilities: by IPAC in collaboration with MM

Affiliates: by the EHO Program in collaboration with MHO

GI/NLI Outbreaks will be declared over:

- 4 days from the onset of symptoms in the most recent patient or
- 2 days after last symptoms in a staff member.

The time can be extended but not shortened.

*Patient: the term "patient" in this document refers to patients, residents and clients in an inpatient acute or long-term care setting
