*Treatment & Prophylaxis for Influenza

For patients within a multi bed room:

- Long Term Care:
 Treatment for positive patients and prophylaxis recommended for exposed
- Acute Care: Treatment for positive patients and prophylaxis at MRP discretion for exposed

Additional Precautions

- All symptomatic patients should be on additional precautions
- Additional Precautions should not impede rehab or mobilisation needs
- Discuss bed closures, admissions, transfers and discharges with OMS
- Patient may go to diagnostic tests wearing a medical-grade mask
- Arrange tray service, cancel communal dining and group activities for affected patients

Unit Lead/Designate

- Post additional precautions and outbreak signs
- Alert visitors to outbreak, direct them to the nursing station prior to visiting any patient
- Complete <u>VRI Line List</u>
- Submit updates: ICP
 (Island Health) or CD
 Program (Affiliates and
 Owned & Operated)
 each morning
