If you have any of the symptoms below, **DO NOT DRIVE**.

Call 9-1-1 or get someone to take you to emergency immediately!

Cirrhosis Complication	Symptoms
Bleeding Varices	Vomiting blood or something that looks like coffee grounds
Bleeding from enlarged veins in the esophagus or stomach bursting open	Black, tar-like bowel movements
Encephalopathy	• Fever
Confusion or sleepiness from a buildup of toxin in the blood	Severe confusion or sleepiness

	Severe nausea or vomiting
Infection in ascites or pleural fluid	• Fever
Infection in fluid buildup in the belly or around the lungs	New or sharp pain in belly or chest that doesn't go away
