2023 - 2024 PRIORITIES PLAN



The Research Ethics & Compliance Office oversees the ethical conduct and decision-making in clinical and health research projects that use human participants, materials and information. Together with Island Health REBs, Operational Review, and Research Compliance, we aim to build capacity in ethics, integrity, and compliance through educating, advising, research, policy and guidance development, and administration. Since March 1, 2020 the office and REBs have reviewed 2863 research study events and activities*.

Our office is based in the territories of the ləkwəŋən speaking Coast Salish Peoples and the SENĆOŦEN speaking WSÁNEĆ People. Our work impacts research conducted across Island Health, with many Indigenous communities, Nations, and Peoples. We are committed in our work to enacting the BC Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples with cultural safety and humility.

Approach

Our work is grounded in a commitment that 'Research is Care,' which speaks to Island Health C.A.R.E. values, This is articulated through ethically-driven research that centres participants who come from diverse communities. We serve these participants using the principles of Respect for Persons, Concern for Welfare, and Justice (TCPS2).

Alignment

Our priorities are informed by Island Health's Five Year Strategic Framework as well as the planning and strategic direction provided within the Island Health Research department.

This framework is guided by a commitment to demonstrating cultural humility in our ways of being, by addressing Indigenous-specific racism and bias, unmet access needs, avoidable variation and harm, workforce capacity and wellness, accountability and adaptability, and disparities in population health and health inequities.
